**The Baptism of the Lord**

January 10, 2016

**First Reading: Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7**

Isaiah tells of the Lord's Servant, who will be inconspicuous, but will not rest until justice is established. The Lord then tells his servant that he was formed to be "a light for the nations."

**Second Reading: Acts 10:34-38**

Peter speaks to a group of pagans for the first time. He explains to them that any person who follows God's will is acceptable to God, regardless of nationality.

**Gospel: Luke 3:15-16, 21-22**

John the Baptist had claimed one would come far more powerful than himself, one who would baptize with the Holy Spirit rather than water. When Jesus came to John and was baptized, the Spirit descended on him and a voice said, "You are my beloved Son. On you my favor rests."

### 2016: A Year of Mercy

Happy New Year! As 2016 gets under way I pray that you had an enjoyable New Year celebration. The church highlights the year in celebration of the Jubilee Year of Mercy proclaimed by Pope Francis. The reminder from Pope Francis is that the year is designed to be lived around the world, not exclusively in Rome. On December 8 Pope Francis inaugurated the Year of Mercy by opening a holy door at St. Peter's Basilica; the Pope also opened the first door outside of Rome which took place in the Cathedral of Bangui, which is the capital of war-torn Central African Republic. This Year of Mercy makes 2016 a year that invites us to make effort to show mercy to others while taking time to accept God's mercy in our lives. To begin this New Year I share with you Pope Francis' Prayer for the Year of Mercy. It is a lovely prayer that may be recited in the classroom, home; at meetings or in church. May the prayer open your eyes to the beauty of Mercy throughout 2016.

Lord Jesus Christ, you have taught us to be merciful like the heavenly Father, and have told us that whoever sees you sees Him. Show us your face and we will be saved.

Response: Show us your mercy, O Lord.

Your loving gaze freed Zacchaeus and Matthew from being enslaved by money; the adulteress and Mary Magdalene from seeking happiness only in created things; made Peter weep after his betrayal, and assured Paradise to the repentant thief. Let us hear, as if addressed to each one of us, the words that you spoke to the Samaritan woman: "If you knew the gift of God!"

Response: Show us your mercy, O Lord.

You are the visible face of the invisible Father, of the God who manifests his power above all by forgiveness and mercy. Let the church be your visible face in the world, its Lord risen and glorified.

Response: Show us your mercy, O Lord.

You willed that your ministers would also be clothed in weakness in order that they may feel compassion for those in ignorance and error. Let everyone who approaches them feel sought after, loved, and forgiven by God.

Response: Show us your mercy, O Lord

Send your spirit and consecrate every one of us with its anointing, so that the Jubilee of Mercy may be a year of grace from the Lord, and your Church, with renewed enthusiasm, may bring good news to the poor, proclaim liberty to captives and the oppressed, and restore sight to the blind.

Response: Show us your mercy, O Lord.

We ask this through the intercession of Mary, Mother of Mercy, you who live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit for ever and ever. Amen.

To celebrate the Year of Mercy, a particular Spiritual or Corporal Work of Mercy will be exhibited in the narthex of the church that makes visible the way that the parish lives out the works of mercy. May 2016 bring to you acceptance of God's mercy as well as the courage to engender mercy into the heart of another who has hurt or offended you. May God bless you in 2016 with his gift of Mercy. 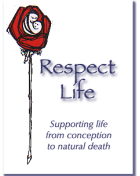

### **Liturgical Postures**

## **liturgy** **corner**

The liturgical postures of standing, sitting, bowing, kneeling, and prostration are the subject of the next few *Liturgy Corners*. Physical gestures and postures assumed during liturgical worship can express outwardly the inner attitudes of the heart and soul. These gestures and postures do not merely "describe" inner attitudes, they actually bring such attitudes "into existence" and manifest the relationship to God that they symbolize.

Standing continues to be the ordinary posture for prayer. Sitting is the posture of rest, of listening, and to reflect on what has been heard. People unable to assume any suggested posture, are to take the posture most convenient for them (sitting for example). A simple bowing of the head is sometimes used for prayer or when receiving a blessing. Per the General Instruction, we are asked to make a sign of reverence, to be determined by the bishops of each country or region, before receiving Communion. The bishops of the United States have chosen standing as the posture to be observed in this country for the reception of communion, the sacrament which unites us in the most profound way possible with Christ who, now gloriously risen from the dead, is the cause of our salvation.
