First Reading: 1 Kings 17:17-24

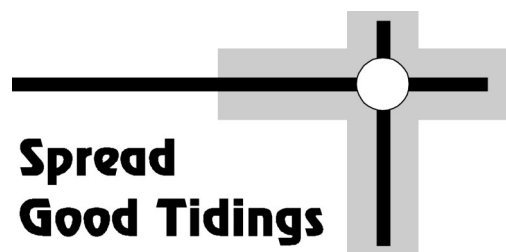

Confirmation

This past Tuesday, May 24 as well as Tuesday, May 17, St. Patrick Church celebrated the Sacrament of Confirmation with Bishop Dominic Marconi presiding at both liturgies. In all, 122 High School students received the Sacrament. Confirmation is the last of the Sacraments of Initiation in the Roman Catholic Church as it enacts upon young people the gifts of the Holy Spirit (wisdom, understanding, right judgment, courage, knowledge, reverence, and wonder of God); therefore, it engenders endurance and backbone, which enhances spiritual growth and maturity upon those in the Catholic faith. Bishop Marconi provided a litany of challenges to our young people with much emphasis in the ability to see equality within human life regardless of color of skin. He illustrates this so vividly through a Denzel Washington film, *Remember The Titans*. A Gift of Faith and Solidarity

The Salesians of Don Bosco know firsthand how the lives of the people of Syria have been rocketed by conflict and war because of the accounts from our works and community in Aleppo, the largest city in Syria. Fr. Pier Jabloyan, a Salesian who was born and raised in Aleppo, describes his city. "The situation in the city is dramatic and difficult. The people do not know what to do, so many are dead and there are so many bombings. There are no longer safe places in the city." He adds, "Death is sown among children and young people, adults and old people, men and women. It seems that the fighting does not spare anyone...the only talk among the people is of death. In Aleppo, we are living an injustice, a scandal that will remain imprinted on the heads of all humanity." Yet, he and another Salesian chose to remain in Aleppo. The Oratory (youth center) they continue to run has become an oasis of normality for many children and teenagers. In a recent video, Fr. Jabloyan makes this request: "intensify your prayers for us especially in this Marian month so that through the motherly intercession of Mary Help of Christians the Lord may look upon this wounded land and grant a little peace to the people." We also ask that you collect loose coins for our Salesian brothers and the young people in Syria and elsewhere in our ministries in the Middle East. We serve in Egypt, Israel (Jerusalem), Lebanon, Palestine Territory (Bethlehem), Syria, and Turkey. Some of these places serve Christians and other refugees fleeing the wars in the region. No amount is too small.

Your prayers and sacrifices in this Year of Mercy give the Salesians and the young people and the people in need who the Salesians serve both a gift of faith and solidarity.
